RWI Announcement No.06 – Response to Misrepresentation and Fraudulent Behaviors

Dear Stakeholder,

Of recent there has been several incidences of less than desirable behaviors within the Africa used vehicle export pathway. This feedback has been received from the Importing countries regulatory bodies. JEVIC asks that all stakeholders take notice of this information.

These behaviors include but are not limited to;

- The misrepresentation of vehicles in terms of “as new” condition.
- The misrepresentation and fraudulent declaration of previous accident damage.
- The exchange of parts, both before and after the inspection completion, in order to fraudulently obtain RWI certification.
- Attempts to misrepresent of the Year of Manufacture of the vehicle.
- Failure to deliver vehicles that have been paid for.
- Fraudulently selling “non-existent” vehicles.

It is the Importing countries’ wish to reduce the damage caused by these types of behaviors.

Exporters / Dealers found to be engaged in these acts will be blacklisted by the regulatory bodies concerned.

In addition, this information will be shared across the importing countries, further widening the punitive effect.

JEVIC asks that all stakeholders take notice of this announcement, and act responsibly for the good of the market segment and industry as a whole.
